

THE HIDDEN HISTORY OF

JUNÈTEENTH

On June 19, 1865, U.S. Major General Gordon Granger arrived in Texas and issued a proclamation declaring that all slaves were free and there would be absolute equality of personal rights and rights of property between former masters and slaves. This event marked the first effective intervention of the United States in Texas on the side of ending slavery. Granger's proclamation did not immediately end slavery in Texas or ensure the immediate enforcement of the rights of freed slaves. While the proclamation declared freedom for the slaves, it took time and further action to enforce and secure their rights.

Although many African-Americans fled during this time, some across the river to Mexico, and others refused to work, ending slavery was not simply a matter of issuing pronouncements. It was a matter of forcing rebels to obey the law, and the real work of ending slavery was done by the freed people in collaboration with and often backed by the force of the U.S. Army. Granger's proclamation carried a crucial promise of force, and within weeks, 50,000 U.S. troops flooded into the state in a late-arriving occupation.

Against the resistance of many planters who refused to give up slavery, the Army turned to force, spreading more than 40 outposts across Texas to teach rebels the idea of law as an irresistible power to which all must bow. This event marked the basis for the increasingly popular celebrations of Juneteenth, a predominantly African-American holiday celebrating emancipation on or about June 19th every year.








AMAZING SERVICE TO KANSAS CITY

Alvin Brooks was elected to serve as the Sixth District at-large councilman in 1999 and re-elected in February 2003. After his first election, Brooks was appointed as mayor pro tem by Mayor Kay Barnes. In addition to serving as mayor pro tem, Brooks chaired the Public Safety Committee, the Police Capital Improvements Oversight Committee, and the Police Site Selection Committee; and served as vice chair of the Aviation Committee and the Finance and Audit Committee.

In 1991, Brooks was selected as president of the AdHoc Group Against Crime, a broad based grassroots community organization he founded in Kansas City, Missouri, in November 1977.

Brooks holds a State of Missouri Lifetime Teacher's Certificate. He has been a reserve teacher and a visiting instructor at University of Missouri–Kansas City, Penn Valley Community College, and Pioneer Community College.

Brooks services has spanned multiple roles, including:

- Police officer and detective (Kansas City, Missouri)
- Home school coordinator, Kansas City School District
- Director of neighborhood youth corp (NYC) Kansas City—St. Joseph Diocese • Director of school, parents, community relations, Kansas City School District • Director of human relations department (Kansas City, Missouri) • Assistant city manager (Kansas City, Missouri)
- Founder, AdHoc Group Against Crime
- Move UP (a merger of the AdHoc Group Against Crime and Project Neighborhood)

BORN AND RAISED IN KANSAS CITY

Frank White, Jr. has proudly served as Jackson County Executive since 2016 and is the first African-American to hold the position in the County's history. As the chief elected official in Jackson County, Missouri, Executive White is committed to building a better and more equitable community.

County Executive White's vision to achieve that goal is rooted in the County's signature program, Our Healthy Kansas City Eastside, which aims to address health care inequities on the city's eastside by increasing access to COVID-19 vaccines and other preventative health services. He is also proud of the achievement to provide long-overdue fair, living wages to county staff and establish Juneteenth as a county holiday, ensuring the critical day in history is appropriately acknowledged and honored.

A proud product of Kansas City's Eastside, attending Lincoln High School and finding his love for baseball on the east side, County Executive White played 18 years with the hometown team Kansas City Royals. During that time, he earned eight Gold Gloves and made five All-Star appearances, solidifying him a spot into the Royals Hall of Fame and the retirement of his No. 20 jersey at Kauffman Stadium. Highlighted by helping lead the Royals to their first-ever World Series Championship in 1985, County Executive White was the first second baseman to hit clean up in a World Series since Jackie Robinson.
